Christ commands us to go forth and make disciples of all nations. How, then, as Orthodox Christians should we respond to His admonition? Contrary to the perception that evangelization involves one person attempting to introduce another to Christ, our Faith teaches that evangelization is a communal effort, which is not fulfilled until a person is brought into communion with the Church and integrated into the life of a community. Fr. Eric will discuss how we, as individuals and as a community, can find ways to make evangelism a center of parish life.

An archpriest and current Secretary of the Orthodox Church in America, Fr. Eric G. Tosi has served as pastor, military chaplain, and academician during a noteworthy and varied ministry. He is an assistant professor of liturgics at St. Vladimir's Orthodox Seminary and has BA, MA from Fordham University, MDiv from St. Vladimir's Seminary, and Doctor of Ministry from the University of Toronto. Fr. Tosi is a specialist in evangelism and missions and has spoken on these subjects throughout the world, from Cambridge University to Albania. A former captain in the US Army, he is married and has two children.
